Concolor Fir (White Fir) <i>Lumber, wildlife, windbreak, adaptable</i>	S-Med	4-7	30-50'	20-25'
White Pine <i>Native, loosely pyramidal, becomes irregular with age</i>	Fast	3-8	50-80'	20-40'
CO Blue Spruce <i>Most popular spruce, hardy &amp; attractive blue color</i>	Med	2-7	30-60'	10-20'
Norway Spruce <i>Pyramidal tree; becomes very graceful in maturity</i>	Med	2-7	40-60'	25-30'
White Spruce <i>Dense, pyramidal tree; hedges and windbreaks</i>	Med	2-6	40-60'	25-30'

Hazelnut <i>Windbreak, easy to crack nuts, wildlife (squirrels)</i>	M-Fast	4-9	15-18'	10-12'
Lilac <i>Broad oval leaves, extremely fragrant in early May</i>	Med	3-7	8-15'	6-12'
Red Maple <i>Full sun, prefers wet areas, fall colors vary; great for shade</i>	M-Fast	3-9	40-60'	40'
