Block unsightly views
 Ceremonial/Celebrations
 Clean the air & clean the soil
 Create unique fall foliage
 Decrease street noise
 Decrease water pollution
 Economic opportunities
 Fight soil erosion
 Habitat for wildlife/songbirds
 Harvest wood, mulch, lumber, or firewood

Increase property value
 Living snow fence & windbreak
 Nuts, berries, syrup
 Play area for children
 Produce oxygen
 Provide shade
 Reduce cooling costs 15-35%
 Reduce heating costs 10-30%
 Slow stormwater runoff

What are the most popular Christmas trees? *Fraser Fir, Douglas Fir, Balsam Fir, and Colorado Blue Spruce consistently rank the highest.*

What can I do about deer? *Avoid planting trees with soft needles, like cedars and firs, unless precautions are used to deter deer. (Netting, fencing, floodlights, certain odors, etc.)*
