Additional funding is available for CAFO Waste Storages, but proposals should incorporate climate legislation with a cover, retrofitted for a future cover, or some type of greenhouse gas/methane reduction. Districts are asked to participate in the upcoming State Programs Advisory Committee; Performance Measures credit will be given to any participating board member. AEM Leopold nominations are due May 15.

FSA: Mary Jane's written report was submitted and distributed.

Director Reports:

Eastman: Attended Cornell's Dairy Shop meeting; it focused on forage and field cropping season. It was a good discussion; every season has its own challenges.

Kiechle: Attended Farm Bureau's lobby days in Albany. We met with staff and an Assemblywoman sponsoring a bill to restrict the use of Rompun. We explained the farm's need for Rompun and that it reduces stress for the animals. Unfortunately, some are mixing it with illegal drugs. It has been used for 50 years as a safe, effective tool for farms. It was a good conversation and she seemed to understand our perspective. We had a booth at the Taste of NY reception; people were seeking cheese curd and Duane Smith's honeyberry jam. The Governor spent an hour at the reception and tasted our products. There were more people than ever; it was a packed event.

- B. Ruffed Grouse Society is writing a grant for a project, "Delivering private and public lands conservation for forest and shrubland species in the Great Lakes Basin of Northern NY". They have requested a letter of support. Our existing forestry practices encourage early successional trees and create an environment conducive to the desired habitat. Director Boxberger moved to send a letter of support for the Ruffed Grouse Society's project as explained. Director Brass seconded the motion. Carried.
